STOP AND REVIEW OF THE LARGE RENEWABLE ENERGY PLANTS MODEL.

- a) Considering Council Directive 92/43/EEC of 21 May 1992 on the conservation of natural habitats and of wild fauna and flora and Directive 2009/147/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 30 November 2009 on the conservation of wild birds) that establish priority on the conservation of biodiversity.
- b) Considering Directive 2001/42/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 June 2001 on the assessment of the effects of certain plans and programmes on the environment Directive 2001/42 / EC, by which the preparation and approval of certain plans and programs may have a prior verification and evaluation of their effects on the environment
- c) Directive (EU) 2019/944 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 5 June 2019 on common rules for the internal market for electricity and amending Directive 2012/27/EU, in Article 8, when regulating the authorization procedures for new capacity, Member States shall adopt an authorisation procedure and they shall consider the protection of public health and safety, the protection of the environment, land use and siting, the use of public ground;, energy efficiency and the nature of the primary sources;

the European Free Alliance calls for:

- 1. To act by suspending the Large Renowable Energy Plants in the Spanish State that endanger areas of high ecological, agricultural, landscape, social and cultural value and open an investigation on the authorization procedure for installations.
- 2. To establish common criteria that limit the size of new photovoltaic and wind projects, moving towards a model of "energy sovereignty of the nations of Europe", adapted to the territories.

Reasoning:

The massive and disorderly expansion of renewable energies involves the occupation of hundreds of thousands of hectares with solar and wind power plants. Many of these renewable energy plants affect areas of high ecological, agricultural, landscape, social and cultural value.



Excessive speculation by large investment funds is taking advantage of the weaknesses of our administrations and the lack of information from citizens to implement almost infinite surfaces of photovoltaic panels. This trend is already saturating the networks and the evacuation points that users maintain through the electricity bill, which also blocks access to local photovoltaic initiatives, in such a way that a large part of the solar heritage is It will be used by foreign entities without leaving wealth or employment in our municipalities and regions.

The damage to the balance and cohesion of the territory, to biodiversity and to sustainable local development is greater in centralized renewable facilities, while distributed generation and small renewable facilities allow greater compatibility with spatial planning due to their proximity to centers of consumption.

In Spain there are four of the five largest photovoltaic parks in Europe.
