Title (of the Motion)	Justice and Truth for Yvan COLONNA

- Considering article 3 of the European Convention on Human Rights prohibiting inhuman and degrading treatment;

## Considering:

- a) That Yvan Colonna, a Corsican patriot, having always proclaimed his innocence, was murdered in the central prison of Arles on March 2, 2022 by a jihadist;
- b) That the successive governments have been practicing for years a policy of state vengeance that does not respect the Law;
- c) That if the law had been applied and the status of a prisoner with special status removed, Yvan Colonna would have been brought closer to Corsica at the Borgu prison and would not have been murdered;
- d) That the security conditions were not ensured by the State prison administration in a prison dedicated to the management of so-called "particularly watched" prisoners;
- e) That despite significant signs of radicalism, Elong ABE, the presumed assassin of Yvan Colonna, has not been directed to a radicalization evaluation unit;
- f) That despite a past as an Islamic terrorist known to have been in Afghanistan and a prison career punctuated by numerous acts of violence, Franck Elong ABE benefited from preferential treatment allowing him to hold a job as an auxiliary within the prison;
- g) That at the same time, Yvan COLONNA has never been removed from the register of particularly supervised prisoners, preventing de facto his return to Corsica and a possible adjustment of his sentence, thus subjecting him to a sentence of life without parole;
- h) That the parliamentary commission of inquiry charged with shedding light on the dysfunctions within the penitentiary administration and the judicial system that led to the assassination of Yvan COLONNA wonders about the disappearance of certain data from the GENESIS file (software for processing data on prisoners);

## The European Free Alliance:



- 1) Reiterates its support to the family of Yvan Colonna in this painful ordeal;
- 2) Affirms that the truth must come out and justice must be done in this terrible affair;
- 3) Denounces the policy of the French State concerning the management of political prisoners, which has partly caused this tragedy;
- 4) Affirms that the French State must take into account the conclusions of the parliamentary commission of inquiry charged with shedding light on the dysfunctions within the prison administration and the judicial system that led to the assassination of Yvan COLONNA.
