Title [of the Motion]	Reunification of Brittany
<p>The question of the reunification of Brittany is a cultural question but also a democratic issue.</p> <p>Loire-Atlantique has been separated from the rest of Brittany for 80 years, a decision confirmed during the various stages of organization of French territories.</p> <p>For the Breton Democratic Union, the question of a reunified Brittany is fundamentally democratic: neither the demand made by 10% of the citizens of Loire Atlantique in 2018, nor the majority wish expressed by Bretons and Bretons for decades can remain unanswered.</p> <p>Beyond the historical dimension, a "desire for Brittany" is expressed everywhere in Loire-Atlantique, in the field of education [bilingual schools, courses for adults, etc.], culture [dance, music, singing, etc.], tourism [structures such as Destination Bretagne] or ecology [associations, etc.].</p> <p>Since 2020, more than twenty cities, including Nantes, Rennes, Brest, Vannes, Saint-Brieuc, Saint-Nazaire, etc., have adopted wishes asking the French State to initiate the process that will make it possible to follow up on this citizen request.</p> <p>The situation in Brittany is not unique in a centralized France. Alsace, the Basque Country, Savoy or Catalonia, in particular, claim changes for their territory.</p> <p>Today, the purpose of the motion that we are carrying is to raise at European level, with our EFA partners, the requirement for a legislative process which makes possible to first consult the voters of Loire-Atlantique on their wish to join, or not, the Brittany administrative region.</p> <p>Also, the EFA:</p> <p>Supports the administrative reunification of Brittany and calls for a redistricting of the French regions taking into account the will of the peoples of these territories.</p>
